Thank you for registering to vote! This mailer contains information for the February 9, 2016 North Orange County Community College District Special Vacancy Election. Please take a moment to be prepared prior to voting.

This is an all-mail ballot election. **There will NOT be voting at polling places.** You may return your voted ballot by one of the following methods:

- By mail: The envelope must be signed, dated, and postmarked on or before Election Day, and must be received no later than three days after Election Day.
- At the Registrar of Voters' office, no later than Election Day, 8:00 p.m.

VOTER INFORMATION

Can I vote at a polling place?

No. This is an all-mail ballot election. No polling place voting will be conducted.

Can I vote if I moved to another address in Orange County?

Yes. But you must register at your new address for future elections. You may vote and re-register at the Registrar of Voters' office, 1300 S. Grand Avenue, Building C, Santa Ana.

To find out if you're registered, visit: ocvote.com/verify.

Can I vote if I have not voted in the last 4 years?

Residence Confirmation: If you have not voted in any election within the preceding four years, and your residence address, name, or party preference was not updated during that time, you need to confirm your residency address in order to remain on the active voter list and receive election materials in the mail. Visit ocvote.com/confirm to confirm your residency.

How do I turn in my vote-by-mail ballot?

Return your voted ballot in the envelope provided:

- By mail: The envelope must be signed, dated, and postmarked on or before Election Day, and must be received no later than three days after Election Day.
- At the Registrar of Voters' office, no later than Election Day, 8:00 p.m.

If you are unable to return your ballot, use the envelope provided to authorize one of these people to return it for you.

- Spouse;
- Child or parent;
- Grandparent or grandchild;
- Brother or sister; or
- Someone who lives with you.

If you are not a permanent vote-by-mail voter, you may visit ocvote.com/voting to download a permanent vote-by-mail voter application.

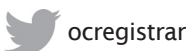

THIS IS AN ALL-MAIL BALLOT ELECTION. NO POLLING PLACE VOTING WILL BE CONDUCTED.

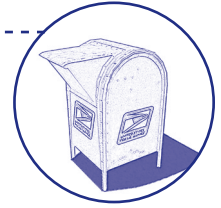
How to Mail Your Mail Ballot

Put only your voted ballot in the envelope provided. Fill in your home address, and sign and date the envelope.

Note: You cannot use a power of attorney.

If you cannot sign:

- Make an “X” while someone watches. That person must print your name near your “X”, and sign.
- You may use a signature stamp ONLY if you already filled out a voter registration at the Registrar of Voters’ office (or through the DMV), and you used that stamp to sign your name.



What to Do if You Make a Mistake or Lose Your Ballot

If you make a mistake, cross out the error and mark your new choice. If your original ballot is lost, spoiled or damaged, call us at (714) 567-7600 or visit ocvote.com/replacement

How to Turn in Your Mail Ballot

Return your voted ballot in the envelope provided:

- By mail* – A 49¢ stamp must be applied. (This language is required by the US Postal Service to be included in these instructions.)
- At the Registrar of Voters’ office (1300 South Grand Avenue, Building C, Santa Ana, CA 92705), no later than Election Day, 8:00 p.m.



***IMPORTANT!** Your mailed, voted ballot will be processed if the envelope is signed, dated and postmarked on or before Election Day, and is received no later than three days after Election Day.

If you are unable to return your ballot, use the enclosed envelope to authorize one of these people to return it for you: Spouse, child or parent, grandparent or grandchild, brother or sister, or someone who lives with you. You must state how the person returning the envelope is related to you.

Important! You must sign the envelope. A voter failing to sign his/her ballot identification envelope will be sent an “Unsigned Ballot Statement”. This statement must be signed and returned to the Registrar of Voters office no later than eight days after the election for the ballot to be counted.

Important! We cannot count your mail ballot if:

- You did not sign the envelope
- You did not use the envelope provided
- Your ballot arrived late
- Someone turned in your ballot without your signed authorization

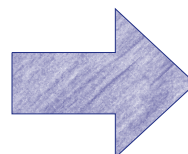
