For eight years on the Garden Grove City Council and two years on the Orange County Transportation Authority board, I have fought for you.

As a councilman, I worked to bring ten new hotels, thousands of jobs, and transportation improvements to Garden Grove. Through a police strategic plan, we put more police on the streets. We added two parks and built a multi-purpose gymnasium. Property values are up and crime is down. My colleagues have elected me mayor pro tem four times.

As an OCTA board member, I led the charge to widen the 22 freeway. My efforts led to more lanes, soundwalls, rubberized asphalt, and widened underpasses. I worked to protect the ACCESS service.

I have stood up to the county bureaucrats. At OCTA, I stopped a plan that would have taken 100 homes and businesses in Westminster for the 405 widening. I killed a proposal to increase the gas tax.

I served on the John Wayne Airport Commission in the dark days after 9/11. I served on the county's Integrated Waste Management Commission. I won't need on-the-job training.

As supervisor, I will put the First District first. The original Measure M had ten lanes for the El Toro Y and none for the 22. Our supervisor has to do better in the new Measure M.

The First District has 20% of the county population and no county parks. Our supervisor has to change that. Let's turn the Santa Ana River basin and the Pacific Electric Right of Way into linear parks, and make sure any change at Willowick includes open land for everybody, not just golfers.

When a paroled sex offender moved near a school, I picketed with the neighbors. I'll fight to implement Proposition 83 and GPS monitoring.

Former First District Supervisor Chuck Smith has endorsed me because I will be an outspoken and independent voice for First District residents.

The Supervisors oversee the county's crucial medical, environmental, and infrastructure resources. The annual county budget is \$5.53 Billion. The job's too serious to be a stepping stone or a consolation prize.

I love this community. My wife Sandy and I just celebrated our 30th wedding anniversary. All three of our children have attended Garden Grove public schools. I graduated from the University of California and UCLA Law School. We've donated time to various churches, the Boys and Girls Club, and the police association.
