

**FULL TEXT OF MEASURE Q  
CITY OF GARDEN GROVE**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE  
AMENDING SUBSECTION 020(b)(3) OF CHAPTER 4 OF TITLE 2 OF THE GARDEN  
GROVE MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO TERM LIMITS.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE DO HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Subsection 020(b)(3) of Chapter 4 of Title 2 of the Garden Grove Municipal Code is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

(3) Subsequent Terms.

(A) No person shall be eligible for further election or appointment to the office of Mayor after completing four (4) consecutive terms in that office, as set forth in subsection (b)(1) above, until not less than two (2) years has or will have elapsed between the most recent date of such person's prior service as Mayor and the effective date of such person's most recent election or appointment to such office.

(B) No person shall be eligible for further election or appointment to the office of Councilmember after completing two (2) consecutive terms in that office, as set forth in subsection (b)(2) above, until not less than two (2) years has or will have elapsed between the most recent date of such person's prior service as a Councilmember and the effective date of such person's most recent election or appointment to such office.

(C) In the context of election to office, the phrase "two years" as used in this Section 020 shall mean the period between the date of assumption of office by elected officeholders following any general municipal election held in November of any even numbered year and the date of the assumption of office by elected officeholders following any general municipal election held in November of any immediately preceding or immediately succeeding even numbered year, even though such period may be more or less than an actual period of two years. In the context of an appointment to office, the phrase "two years" shall mean two calendar years.

SECTION 2. Severability. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, word or portion of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.
