

REBUTTAL TO ARGUMENT AGAINST MEASURE T

The opponent's argument is FALSE. Don't be misled.

ELIMINATED: In just 3 years, the City has slashed 20 essential community service provider positions.

ELIMINATED: The DARE program, which counsels kids away from gangs and drugs, has been cut for lack of funds.

ELIMINATED: Three Community Events – The Spring Extravaganza, Jack-O'-Lantern Jamboree & Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony canceled.

REDUCED: Funding for the Children's Museum & Summer Concerts has been slashed.

The Governor has proposed funding cuts that threaten the quality of essential City services, including \$375,000 from our Police Department - the cost of 3 police officers.

YES on T ensures we can keep our children from gangs/drugs, by funding more school police officers, anti-gang/drug prevention programs, and after-school programs that keep kids out of trouble.
