

## REBUTTAL TO ARGUMENT AGAINST MEASURE A

### **Measure A preserves the quality of life for all Buena Park residents -**

We have at least 60% less recreational space than the State recommends and traffic is getting worse.

### **Measure A is clear -**

It does not stop progress, but allows us to vote if the City wants to give exceptions to rich developers to change the small amount of "open space" zoned land left in Buena Park. No other zoning is affected!

### **Measure A respects our zoning laws -**

It does not change any of Edison's or public parks' current allowable uses! New businesses will continue to open on "commercial" and "industrial" land and housing will be built in "residential" zoning.

### **Measure A is honest -**

The City Council actually voted to convert Larwin Park into an apartment complex last year! We lost both private and public "open space" zoned land like the Big Tee Golf Course and the Whitaker-Jaynes Estate Park to stores, houses and parking lots against the wishes of thousands of citizens.

7,240 average playing residents, through an Initiative, asked for a level playing field with wealthy, politically-connected developers.
