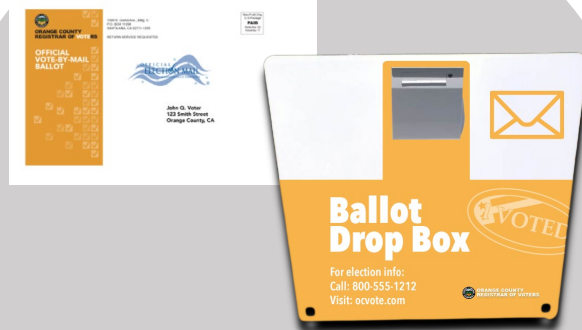

Voting Assistance

Senate Bill 504

- Expands conditional voter registration to overseas and military voters and voters who require assistance marking a ballot
- Urgency legislation signed by Governor on March 31
- ROV Team is finalizing plans for promoting and offering this service to newly eligible voters in Primary Election

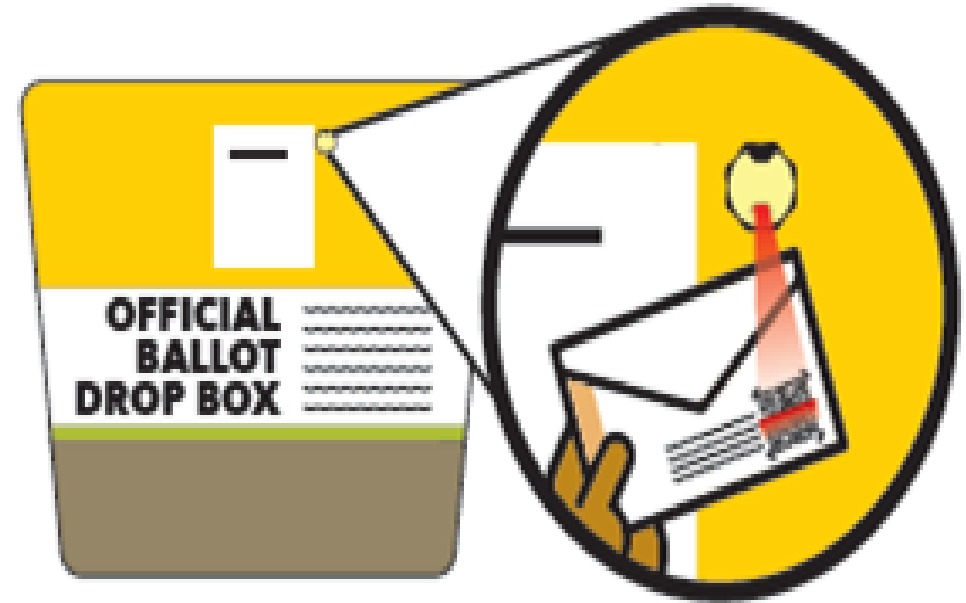

Redistricting for Statewide General Election

- School Districts were required to adopt new maps by February 28
- Cities and Special Districts must adopt new maps by April 17
- New jurisdiction maps must be provided to ROV by July 6
- ROV encourages early submission of maps



Redistricting for Statewide General Election

- School Districts – 19 of 28 submitted maps
- Cities – 12 of 17 submitted maps
- Special Districts – 3 of 6 submitted maps



Redistricting for Statewide General Election

- ROV Maps team will be working on changes offline, in GIS
- Precinct and voter information changes cannot be applied in production until after Primary Election results are certified
- Voter files and maps incorporating new local jurisdictional maps will be available by start of candidate filing period on July 18
